

## **Contractors' Works for Bures St Mary Parish Council Meeting 25.09.25**

Sudbury Road lay-by needs attention

Dog and general waste bins emptied weekly (Jack Perfect-Brown) – Tuesdays

Cuckoo Hill and Wharf Lane grass verges cut max. x 12 cuts a year (Jack Perfect-Brown)  
Cut this month

Grass cut at Pikes Marsh open space as marked on plan – max 6 cuts a year. (Jack Perfect-Brown) -

Pikes Marsh garden shrub area – to be tidied this autumn and damaged fencing to be repaired/removed (Resident's request) Jack Perfect-Brown

Pikes Marsh Hazel tree to be trimmed as required

Path cleared through wooded area to the rear of Beaumont Close to access the permissive path – once a year good clearance (if finances allow)

Strim and tidy grass bank off Beaumont Close carpark– 4 cuts per season

Ditch area at the back of Beaumont Close- brambles cut back over the summer

Strimming PROW beside Old Police House, Nayland Road on a volunteer basis- clear

Clearance of the bank and PROW access from the Sudbury Road layby by arrangement –  
**Still to be strimmed and cleared of litter.**

Boundary hedge adjacent to no 9 Eves Orchard overlooking wildflower area off Claypits Avenue- a cut has been requested

Nettles cut back around 30mph sign in the Cuckoo Hill bank – will need a cut back this autumn

Strimming next to the pumping station at the end of Claypits and Nayland Road- clear

Clearance around the “Kill Your Speed” sign on the Nayland Road when required.

The boundary verge along St Edmunds Lane (the back of Apple Tree Mews) monitored for debris. **Still to be cleared.**

Suffolk County Council has reversed their policy on the use of glyphosate. The Parish Council have agreed not to use glyphosate.

Street cleaning completed as per contract (3 hours pw Charlie Series)

Babergh District Council responsible for roadside verges- looking clear.
