MAN ARRESTED FOLLOWING A RAID WITHAM Allectus Way

Tuesday August 26th

A 26 year old man was arrested during a raid by Officers from Braintree Neighbourhood Policing Teams (NPT) investigating the supply of drugs.

The man was arrested on suspicion of possession with intent to supply Class A and Class B drugs and of administrating a noxious substance.

During the search of the property NPT Officers recovered quantities of what is suspected to be cocaine and cannabis and large sum of cash.

Also was seized were several mobile phones. Essex Police investigations continues. PC Aris Sahan said "Violence and other serious crimes, which cause harm to vulnerable people and the communities they live in, are often associated with drugs. We focus on identifying, investigating and tackling these crimes and related anti-scoial behaviour but we need information from the public to help us do so. Please tell us what you know about criminal activity and anti-social behaviour in your area ie.Car number plates, names, CCTV and door bell images are particularly helpful but any information related to crime and criminal activity may be useful to us..

Please dont assume we know already.

ESSEX POLICE CRIME REPORTS UPDATE

There was a meeting at which most of the ECNWA Districts attended at Essex Police HQ on 28th August, and Braintree District NW was represented, to discuss the future of the (new) automated crime reports as regards both the format and the accessability now that there are no longer EWLO's and any human involvement

Essex Police confirmed that for the near future the crime reports information will be the same...

So yes sadly we will not have the specific details we used to have in the past thirty years (this is, as I have said recently, in line with other Police Services in England ie Suffolk, Norfolk, Cambridge and many other NW Associations now only receive statistics and %'s on local crime and mostly it is bi-monthly certainly not weekly. If you wanted to have such statistics they have always been available from Essex Police website if you know how to look for them ..

We have been really fortunate to have such details of local crimes for so long..

So yes we are unable now to be "the eyes and ears in our communities for Essex Police" as regards crimes ie motor vehicles being stolen near you, as we will not have the information.....

However Essex Police said that they will try to add more details when they can.

From October 1st each NW District Co-ordinator ie Braintree District wlll not receive any crime reports directly but will be given the details to see them on the Essex Police website so there should not be any change in what is in the newsletter..

However the information will not be available until Wednesday of each week but the newsletter will still be distributed by email on Mondays ..

It may seem then that the "details of crime" are a little "late" but as you know the "details" are not very helpful at times for the "traditional" Neighbourhood Watch member.

Since the new crime reports format has taken place you can see that I have published other Essex Police information from Braintree Essex Police Dispatch newsletters and also Braintree Essex Police Facebook.

Now some of you may already receive this information but many of you do not as I have been advised that "Facebook" is not really of "interest" and they do not want to subscribe to Essex Police Dispatch newsletter as they just want to see the Neighbourhood Watch information from one source ie the Braintree District NW newsletter which has been in existence since for 16 years.

Essex Police has recommended that each of the District Co-ordinators (ie Braintree District) should have regular meetings or communications with their NPT (Neighbourhhood Policing Teams).

So I have this week sent an email to PC James Draper to see how I can organise it.

So there you are ..all updated..

So my view, having been involved with Neighbourhood Watch for over 37 years is that we must work with Essex Police in whatever way is best for them..

Neighbourhood Watch must never be a "problem" with Essex Police but a good "partner" using whatever information they give us in any format ..

We have been in the UK since 1982 to help to reduce the opportunity of crime distributing information from reliable sources ie Essex Police, The Police Fire & Crime Commissioner's Office , Essex Fire & Rescue Service , Crimestoppers and Victim Support as that is what we do..and I know so many of you do this very well indeed especially giving what time you have in your busy lives and also your health , your family's health and work commitments are more important than Neighbourhood Watch

<u>So I very much appreciate all that you do..and I do know that Essex Police do as well.</u>

Yes we must move forward with whatever information we have and in whatever format and continue to care about others who may feel vulnerable, whatever their age, to help them be more effective in protecting their personal property that is our role!!

Finally can I say that I have been very moved by the comments recently received as I am just action NW in Braintree District to the best of my abilties..so thank you Clive Stewart, Chairman Braintree District NW
